

Chugach parking lot upgrade

A parking lot upgrade project will temporarily change parking for members at the Chugach Headquarters building on Electron Drive.

Beginning June 3, member parking will be moved from the south side of the building to a lot on the east side of the building.

During the construction period, expected to last through the summer, there will be no payment drop box outside the Chugach lobby, and there will be no electric vehicle charging available. Members are encouraged to set up online payments to avoid any disruption in service.
